

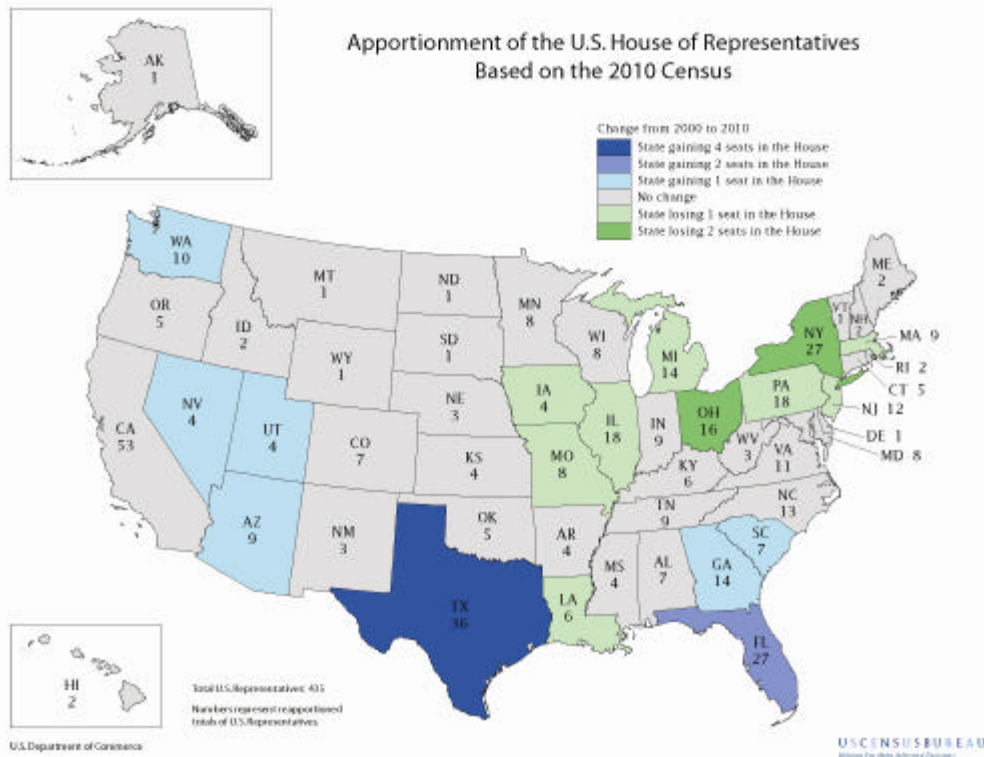
# Census Circular

## Release of Redistricting Data: Population, Race, Voting Age and Housing Units

“Apportionment” is the process of determining how many representatives each state is entitled to. According to the Constitution, the census has one fundamental purpose: to ensure that the representation of each state in the U.S. House of Representatives reflects the relative size of its population as compared with other states. There are 435 representatives divided up among the 50 states. Each one of these representatives is elected by the voters of a congressional district. Populous states have more representatives than less populous states. The 2010 Census resulted in an apportionment of 14 representatives for the State of Michigan, which represents a loss of one seat in the House (see graphic below).

Redistricting is the process by which state governments redraw U.S. congressional and state legislative districts. According to Public Law 94-171, the Census Bureau must provide redistricting data to the 50 states no later than April 1 of the year following the census. As a result, the Census Bureau is delivering the data state-by-state on a flow basis in February and March. Michigan is one of the last states to receive data.
